Glen Echo Country Club is the oldest 18-hole private course west of the Mississippi River opening in May of 1901. The course was designed by the 1896 U.S. Open Champion Jim Foulis and his brother Robert who were inspired and tutored by old Tom Morris of the Links of St. Andrews. Glen Echo also hosted the only Olympic golf matches held on American soil in 1904.
